State of Illinois Taxes

Corporate Income Tax

Calculated from reported federal income. The rate is 9.5% based on a 7% income tax and 2.5% replacement tax.

Sales/Use Tax

Sales tax of 6.25% is imposed on the purchase price of tangible personal property for use or consumption.

Property Tax

The State of Illinois levies no property taxes. Counties and municipalities, however, do levy these taxes.

Unemployment Compensation

Maximum rate is 8.4%, however, most employers will pay at the entry rate of 3.8%. Contribution payments are subject to only the first \$12,740 of wages paid to an employee.
